Oral Requests:

Marejka Sacks, 1603 Walters Ave., Campbell

Ms. Sacks asked about dogs being allowed at Jack Fischer Park, specifically are they allowed to be on the perimeter sidewalk. The neighbors would like to be able to walk their dogs there. This is a neighborhood park, and there are no neighboring sidewalks so you'd have to walk in the street which is a dangerous situation. We are looking for a perimeter walk around this park. The markings are not very clear.

Mr. Nicholas Radov, 102 Bungalow Terrace, Los Gatos

Mr. Radov said his two small kids love playing at the park and he echoed Ms. Sacks' comments, it would be great if we could bring our dogs and walk around the perimeter sidewalk. The neighbors have been doing that and everyone was kind of shocked when Animal Control started ticketing people. We are not asking for dogs to go in the play area, just around the edge of the park.

Mr. Ken Campbell, 1440 Juanita Way, Campbell

Mr. Campbell stated his wife had a broken back and not having any sidewalks in their area, it's unsafe for her to walk. Most people try to keep their dogs under control. He finds it humorous that kids are allowed but not dogs.

Director Capurso responded that the ordinance does say there are no dogs allowed in parks in general. What makes Jack Fischer Park unique is the lack of a perimeter sidewalk; the park ends at the street. In order to allow dogs at any park it would need to be amended, there would need to be a public hearing. The Commission could make a recommendation to the Council who then would need to authorize the change to the ordinance. Staff

would need clarity regarding does the Commission want to discuss parks in general or Jack Fischer in particular. It is up to the Commission to get it on the agenda.

Announcements:

Chair Scholberg welcomed Commissioner Doherty and asked her to say a few words. Commissioner Doherty said she worked for the City of Campbell for 28 years, is almost a lifelong Campbell resident, grew up here, and felt this would be a good opportunity to give back to the community. She was the recording secretary for the Civic Improvement Commission. She is looking forward to working with the Parks and Recreation Commission.

New Business

1. Park Dedication Fund Policy

Director Maurantonio presented her report.

At the August 3, 2016 study session the Commission had recommended the following categories be included in the Policy:

- Acquire and develop new parks and open space
- Rehabilitation of existing facilities on City-owned property
- Development of new park facilities on existing City-owned property
- Rehabilitate existing recreational facilities and open space on non-City-owned property.
- Develop non-City-owned property in conjunction with a joint use agreement.

The next steps would be if the Parks and Recreation Commission votes to recommend the draft Parkland Dedication Fund Policy, staff will present this to Council for final approval and adoption.

Alternatives would be to not approve changes to the draft Parkland Dedication Fund Policy and provide different direction to staff.

2. Update on Wastewater Treatment Facility Tour

Commissioners Davidson, Ptaszynski, Scholberg and Director Maurantonio attended the tour. They found it really interesting, well maintained and learned a lot.

Committee Reports:

Parks and Creek Trail: Commissioner Gibson said staff did a great job on the basketball courts at Campbell Park. It went really quick and looks great. Congratulations. He also said the Los Gatos Creek Trail repairs seemed to go very well. He said the turf is looking a little stressed but not too bad and asked how the water conservation efforts are going.

Superintendent Mordwinow said the only issues on the Trail project were the bicyclists moving the barricades. He stated staff is still operating under the same watering schedule as last year, conserving 20 to 30%.

Commissioner Gibson mentioned the vandalism at Jack Fischer Park where a vehicle tore up the turf and asked if staff is satisfied with the repairs. He still sees the tire ruts. Superintendent Mordwinow responded that he has not seen the park yet.

Trees: Commissioner Davidson no report.

Special Events: Commissioner Hughes no report.

Staff Reports:

General Plan Update

No report.

Parks: Director Capurso

- Trail resurfacing was highly successful. Staff did an exceptional job managing the project.
- Water Management – San Jose Water lowered the restriction from 35% to 25%, staff has taken a resolution to Council to adjust the water ordinance for the City. Going from Tier 3 to 2 allows us to irrigate 3 days per week instead of the 2 that we were limited to.
- Par Course renovation is scheduled to start later this month.
- The basketball court project was mentioned.
- Staff is beginning a water meter and backflow replacement at the Community Center to separate the stadium section from the main field area.
- The west Historic Downtown entrance has been cleared out. The re-landscaping will start later in September.
- Staff is doing preliminary work on potentially purchasing two properties.
- Staff is beginning the preliminary assessment and design work on the play lots.

Recreation and Community Services: Director Maurantonio

- Preschool started this week! The staff held parent meetings and open houses last week to get both the parents and students acclimated to school.
- New fitness passes! Recreation now has scan-able Fitness Passes for the Weight Room, Lap Swim and all the drop-in fitness activities. Participants can reload passes from their computers. Switching to the scan-able cards is much more efficient for both customers and the front office staff.
- Remodel of the Q Building and Bathrooms is underway!
- The Adult Center has hired a new Case Manager, Mary Morales. Mary will coordinate support services for seniors to foster independence. Mary has extensive experience providing crisis intervention and counseling to youth and families and is eager to expand her scope of practice with seniors
- The Adult Center also has a new intern Julie LaClair. Julie is an undergraduate Social Work student at San Jose State University. She is excited to work with seniors and the Campbell Community.
- Aquatic Facility Audit – On September 20th we are going to Council to gain approval to issue a RFP for a consultant to be hired.

Commissioner Hughes said Campbell Park, the Creek Trail; the basketball courts all look fantastic. He has noticed people on the trail staying the night, and noticed a big wall around the trail.

Chair Scholberg echoed Scott's comments, great work and great that staff has been learning how to do some of the tasks in house. Welcome to Commissioner Doherty.

Commissioner Walker asked if Campbell is doing all the maintenance why is the trail named the Los Gatos Creek Trail, why not the Campbell Creek Trail. Director Capurso responded that it is named after the Creek.

Commissioner Gibson said he missed the Portals dedication ceremony. The light fixtures are great.

Director Capurso said it was a great event, close to 200 people, there was a great project team, Fred Ho, Reina Antonio, Fletch Parsons, Michelle Quinney, Lisa Petersen and Ian Brunswick to name a few.

Commissioner Gibson asked if the Commission is doing anything for Oktoberfest. Director Maurantonio said there would be more information to come.

Commissioner Doherty said she's glad to be here and is very impressed with Campbell Park. Jack Fischer Park is a great park for kids.

Chair Scholberg asked if the Commission wants to take on the issue of dogs at Jack Fischer Park. Director Capurso asked if the Commission wants to agendize this for the next meeting.



The Parks and Recreation Commission convened in regular session on Wednesday, October 5, 2016, at 7:31 pm, at Campbell Community Center, 1 W. Campbell Ave., Room Q80, Campbell, California.

There was not a quorum to approve the minutes of the September 7th meeting so they will be carried over to the November 2 meeting.

Oral Requests:

Resident Lorenzo mentioned that there are no water fountains and recycling containers on public streets. He asked if they would be put there.

Another resident asked who takes care of the area under the freeway on Pollard road towards Rolling Hills; there are lots of dead birds and garbage there.

Director Maurantonio said staff would make a note of these items. If the resident would like to leave contact information at the end of the meeting staff will get back to her.

New Business

A. Q Building Renovation

Director Maurantonio mentioned that it was one year ago that the Parks and Recreation Commission and the City Council did a walk-through of the Community Center and identified areas that needed improvement. This is one of those rooms in addition to Q84.

The meeting is being held here tonight to show how this room has been renovated through the hard work of Building Maintenance and Public Works. This project was funded through the budget process and supported by your recommendation to City Council.

Director Capurso recognized the hard work done by in-house staff as well as outside contractors; it was very time efficient and the rooms are much more functional now.

B. Review City Ordinance regarding Dogs in Parks

Director Maurantonio reminded the Commission of the residents that came to the last Parks and Recreation meeting to speak about amending the ordinance to allow dogs in Jack Fischer Park and that the Commissioners had voted to agendaize this item for the October 5 meeting.

The City ordinance does not allow dogs on leash in Campbell parks with the exception of Campbell Park and Edith Morley Park. The ordinance was amended in 1999 specifically to allow dogs in Edith Morely Park. Dogs on leash were approved because Edith Morely Park did not include a children's area and the park was not in a residential neighborhood. The ordinance regarding dogs was last amended in 2000 to allow for dogs on leash at Campbell Park (not in the children's water feature and playground areas). The reason for the change was that people would walk their dogs through the park to access the Los Gatos Creek Trail so the ordinance was not enforceable.

The Parks and Recreation Commission last reviewed the ordinance regarding dogs in parks at the Sept. 2, 2009 meeting as part of the discussion of design amenities for the new Stojanovich Family Park. No changes to the ordinance were made at that time.

One of the concerns expressed regarding Jack Fischer Park is that the park does not have sidewalks around its perimeter. Staff could research adding sidewalks or the Commission could explore a change in the ordinance to allow dogs on leash at Jack Fischer Park.

Commissioner Gibson stated that there are sidewalks at the park but he thinks what we're referring to is the monolithic design which puts the curb, gutter and sidewalk in the public right of way. There are meandering walkways which go into the park.

Director Capurso stated that is correct, anyone that wants to use the public sidewalk is actually using the park pathway.

Vice Chair Walker opened the meeting for public comment.

Thirteen people from the neighborhood attended the meeting and spoke in favor of changing the ordinance at Jack Fischer Park to allow dogs on leash. They enjoy walking their dogs, there is not public sidewalk so they would have to walk in the street and it's not safe. They clean up after their dogs and take pride in their park.

Resident Lorenzo asked if there could be dog bag dispensers in the parks that allow dogs. Supervisor Huppe responded that yes, there are bags at the parks that allow dogs.

A comment was made that Council told a resident she did not have to come to the Parks and Recreation meeting, she could just go to the Council meeting and speak under oral request.

Director Maurantonio responded that yes, they could do that, but what the Council could choose to do is refer it back the Parks and Recreation Commission. The process would be public hearing, staff recommendation and the Commission would make a recommendation to go to Council and the process starts again. Staff's role is to provide all the information and give an unbiased viewpoint. Staff

will also express summaries of concerns from residents who want to make the change as well as those who don't. Staff would be reaching out for public input as much as possible. Director Maurantonio said this won't happen next month at the meeting but staff will have to take a look at what is needed.

There was talk about a safety concern, not enough street lights, so they are walking on the street in the dark. Director Maurantonio responded that safety concerns will certainly be a part of the staff report, they will check in with Police and Public Works.

Mr. Clark Haubl spoke about Peachtree being a dark and winding road. He also mentioned that pretty much once a week there's a broken sprinkler. There used to be someone that came out once a week and tested the sprinklers. Director Capurso said yes, staff should be testing the sprinklers. Superintendent Huppe stated that for many years there was a dedicated parks staff person at the park. Over the last 6 months there have been some staff changes and that person was no longer available, but just recently a staff person has been reinstated at the park and he will check the sprinklers. Supervisor Huppe encouraged everyone to give him a call if they should see a broken sprinkler.

It was mentioned that the people that showed up for the meeting have been doing neighborhood watch duty when they walk their dogs at 10:00. Supervisor Huppe said this group does an excellent job as the "neighborhood watch" group.

8:07 pm public comment was closed.

Commissioner Hughes asked how staff would define parks like John D. Morgan Park and Jack Fischer. Director Capurso responded there are different configurations. Fischer is unique in that it is a city block. John D. Morgan is not. He agrees with some of what he's heard tonight. He thinks part of staff's research will show what other cities do. In Los Gatos dogs on leash are OK, except in play areas. This would be a whole different animal depending on if staff is being asked to do research just on Jack Fischer Park or the entire park system.

Commissioner Gibson sees this as a site specific situation. He thinks this is duly and directly related to Jack Fischer Park and that should be the focus of the evaluation. He also thinks the way the park is designed it's a little unusual that the walk ways are fairly wide. With that, there may be some nexus that could help move this in one direction or the other.

Commissioner Hughes asked if there was anyone in the audience that was not a resident of the City of Campbell. There were two people. He said modifying the park itself in terms of the sidewalk is the harder option. Director Capurso responded yes, there would be more to that, and we probably don't want to do that at this point. At this point it may be best to focus on the issue at hand and see how we can provide some sort of resolution for the short term.

Commissioner Gibson asked if we wanted to suggest a trial basis, maybe there are specific pathways they could follow, how would we address that through the ordinance, would it have to be by Council. Director Capurso said he believes there would have to be a Council resolution to reflect the trial basis.

Director Maurantonio stated that in her research she saw mention of a trial period for Campbell Park.

Commissioner Ptaszynski asked how it's handled when a dog gets bitten at the dog park. Capurso did not really know. He does not know if the County takes on any liability or not.

MSC: Ptaszynski/Walker to investigate changing the dog ordinance at Jack Fischer Park to include dogs on leash in the perimeter, away from the kids play areas.

C. Oktoberfest Fun Run

Recreation Supervisor Aaron Bueno thanked the Commissioners for their past years of support for the Fun Runs. He spoke about the color bibs, race medals and children's shirts that will be available this year for the October 15 race. There is some opportunity for volunteers this year handing out packets on Friday night at the Sports Basement. Commissioners Doherty and Walker volunteered to help out on Friday night. Commissioner Gibson will be there Saturday morning for pre-registration.

D. Update on Community Outreach for Park Projects

Director Capurso stated there is a fairly ambitious Capital Improvement Plan as a City, and in particular we have a fair amount of money being proposed for expenditures from the Park Dedication Fund. We have improvements at Campbell Park, design and construction of the playground at the Community Center, and citywide park playground renovations. This means we'll be doing improvements at Jack Fischer, John D. Morgan, Virginia and Hyde Parks over the 5 year period. We are on the early end of the design efforts and are trying to get a handle on all the renovation. The first one is Jack Fischer, it is in an at risk condition, lots of play equipment out there is constructed out of wood. Staff has been at the park for a couple of week nights and this Saturday morning conducting interviews with users to see what they'd like or what they'd like changed. This goes hand in hand with the question of how do we use our Parkland Dedication Fees and what would the policy be. This went successfully through the Commission and the Council and Council has added some language to specify that when staff is going through our playgrounds we're not just renovating but adding capacity and play value. We are going to have an extra effort on that. We want to improve the capacity and the amenities. We will try with Jack Fischer first. We will gather community input, put together design alternatives and conduct a hearing of sorts with the Commission and invite the neighbors of that particular park to attend. Based on that feedback from the Commission and neighbors staff will make modifications and take that forward to Council.

E. Review Parks and Recreation Commission Committees

Commissioner Doherty would like to be on the Parks and Creek Trail Committee.

Committee Reports:

Parks and Creek Trail: Commissioner Gibson said he's trying to get out more to check the conditions at the parks, he's very concerned about the vehicle damage at Fischer Park; there are a lot of weeds and ruts. He'd like to propose a policy that in the event vandalism does occur that we put a time window in for repairs so the public is not inconvenienced for that length of time and that we are still promoting a safe playing environment. He would have had a contractor come in and put new sod in and the field

up and running in 30 days. He does not think the public should be inconvenienced like this and it will be a lot of work for staff now to get the park back in shape. It would be nice to have some kind of policy in effect. The rest of the park itself looks really good. He really appreciates how the playground project was done, the noticing was good. Campbell Park looks really good, the courts came out well. He saw this past week they were getting ready to do some foundation work for the Par course. He did see staff checking irrigation there so he wanted to say thanks.

Trees: No report.

Special Events: Report was provided by Aaron Bueno.

Staff Reports:

General Plan Update

Not a lot to report, staff is working with the consultant on making sure their base information is correct, it had to do with the street system. There have not been any public meetings yet.

Parks: Director Capurso

- New equipment is going in at the Par Course. It's going to be a bit of a new look, equipment will be on the west side, extruded curb around each station, no pressure treated wood.
- Ainsley Park staff is moving forward with installation of bike parking. There should be a larger scale of bike parking, putting 8 or 10 racks between the benches. This will be done in conjunction with expanding bike parking downtown.
- Jack Fischer Park- Commissioner Gibson's email about safety concerns. Staff recognizes there are safety concerns. Staff struggles with the use of water. He does not disagree with Commissioner Gibson's plan to replace the turf; the City just didn't have the water capacity. Staff will be doing turf renovation and reseed the entire park starting next week.

Supervisor Huppe:

- In regards to Jack Fischer Park, you can see the community coming together on the dog situation, they've been a very vocal group and take a lot of pride in the park; he does know they really watch the water there. He gets calls from them whenever they see something wrong. The weeds, ever since the drought started, he's not spraying broadleaf weeds because they are more drought tolerant than regular grass and provide a better cushion. This is one of the key reasons they have been able to meet the water requirements for the State of California. He sent two parks staff out as soon as the call came in regarding the vandalism and after 2 days he felt it was safe to go.
- In regards to the rest of the park system, he's very pleased with the exercise stations.

Commissioner Gibson asked how much will be billed back to the vandals for the repairs since day one. Supervisor Huppe responded that 100% will be billed back, but not the entire reseeding project; just the portion that has gone into the repairs.

Recreation and Community Services: Director Maurantonio

- Recreation is now doing the permitting for Special Events downtown which are community based and do not involve alcohol. Last night the City Council approved a street closure and fee waiver for the DCBA's Creepy Crawly event which will be held on Sunday, October 30th from 4 p.m. – 7 p.m.
- Lots going on at the Museum! The Museum has a new exhibit on display, "Canneries to Computers: the Changing Nature of Work in the Valley" which shows the change from agricultural to Silicon Valley. The Historical Museum will host a talk on "The World Series You Never Heard Of" on Thursday, October 6 from 5 pm -7pm. Spooky Night, a family Halloween event, will be held at the Museum on Friday, October 28th from 2 – 6 p.m. Lastly, tickets are now on sale for the Holiday Teas at the Museum.
- Aquatic Facility Audit – There is a RFP that has been issued. Proposals are due on Friday, October 28th.
- The Adult Center hosted a "Harvest Hoe Down" last Friday, September 30th in OCBH. Seniors enjoyed a BBQ lunch, line dancing and music from the Peninsula Banjo Band.
- The Commission is invited to attend a special ceremony on Friday, October 28th at 8:30 a.m. at the Community Center Pool to celebrate the life of long-time water exercise participant Sylvia Busch. Sylvia passed away recently and her eight children wanted to make a donation that would help the water exercise class that their mother enjoyed so much. The children donated \$4,200 to purchase new portable ADA stairs for the pool in Sylvia's honor. All eight children will be at the ceremony on October 28th to honor the memory of their mother and unveil the new stairs.
- On Thursday, October 20th, the Campbell Youth Commission will partner with both the Cupertino and Saratoga Youth Commission to host "Pizza and Politics," a political event for teens by teens. Guest speakers will include State Senator Jim Beall, Assembly Member Nora Campos, Saratoga Mayor Manny Cappello, Cupertino Mayor Barry Chang and our very own, Campbell Mayor Jason Baker. The event is an opportunity to provide information to teens about the November 8th Presidential election. A mock debate will be held with local representatives who represent the political platforms of the democratic and republican presidential candidates.

Police Activity Report

There was discussion about 2 assaults in parks. Director Maurantonio said both incidents were 15, 16 and 19 year olds who knew each other. One case an arrest was made, and the other case no arrest was made. In talking with police safety and lighting did not come up, it was more about the groups together.

Director Capurso said he had talked to the Chief and they think it might be good to have an officer come to a Commission meeting, so we're planning on having an officer at the November meeting.

Good of the Game

Vice Chair Walker said it looks great in here. Looks like a brand new building.

Commissioner Gibson said great job on the windows in this room

Commissioner Hughes said great lights. The room looks fantastic. It's great to see the ideas you have coming up on the parks projects.



Commissioner Ptaszynski added that he doesn't think the public realizes how much money the staff saves by doing the work themselves.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission approve the attached conceptual design for playground improvements in Jack Fischer Park (Attachment A) and forward the recommendation to Council.

Background

Many of Campbell's parks were constructed in the mid to late 1990's and the play equipment has become worn and outdated, and needs to be replaced. The Parks Maintenance Program Asset Management Plan, presented to Council in November 2015, identified Campbell, Hyde, Jack Fischer, John D. Morgan, and Virginia Parks as the top priorities for equipment replacement and park renovation. The 2016-2017 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) includes a budget of \$100,000 for Citywide Playground Renovations, and the five year CIP provides an additional \$800,000 over the next four years. The Citywide Playground Renovations project goal is to renovate playgrounds and tot-lots at these four parks. Jack Fischer Park was identified as the top priority for renovation based on safety audits, and is the focus of the current fiscal year's project.

Jack Fischer Park was originally opened in 1996 as a neighborhood park. Park play equipment consists of a tot-lot structure for ages 2-5, a swing set, spray water feature, sand and water play feature, and a larger play structure for ages 5-12. To better understand the needs of the community, staff completed a public outreach survey to solicit input from Fischer Park users. The survey was conducted over a period of three weeks (September 26 through October 16) and had both social media and personal contact components. Using the data collected from the public outreach, staff compiled a comprehensive representation of Jack Fischer Park's usage as well as what users would like to see with the renovation project.

Staff found that the majority of children playing at the park are between the ages of two and seven years old. While the park is open from sunrise to a half hour after sunset, peak usage is on weekdays between 10am and 1pm and 3pm to 6pm, and on weekends from 10am-1pm. Most users come on an individual basis; however, there are a high number that come to the park for pre-arranged playdates as well. Weekend usage appears to be by families and for parties. The general consensus from the users is that they like the park as it is, but they understand that due to the age of the structures and associated safety concerns, renovations are needed.

The key features that bring people to Fischer Park include shade, the water feature, green space (including the hill), the general layout of the park, sand, swings, slide, and climbing features. In the new design, users would like to see more climbing features as well as a bigger, possibly spiral slide. There was a general consensus that users would like to keep the organic feel of the park and all of the shade. Additional shade over slides, picnic benches and other locations kids typically touch would be an added benefit.

Based on this input, staff solicited conceptual designs for replacement equipment from several vendors. Survey results were provided to the vendors for use in preparing their designs, as well as the following direction:

- Cap equipment and installation costs at \$150,000;
- Equipment and associated fall zones must fit within existing hardscape layout;
- Include manufacturers / structures with short lead times of 5-6 weeks;
- Include manufacturers that can supply replacement parts on 2-3 week notice;
- Interchangeable components (modular setup) are preferred;
- Increase the number of play stations (currently approximately 18);
- Key Items from the survey to be incorporated:
 - Organic – No bright colors or overly plastic;
 - Keep all trees;
 - Equipment to provide shade, and place slides and other elements within existing shade to the maximum extent possible.
 - Equipment should include slides, climbing elements, bars (monkey & hanging);
 - Include options for modular equipment swaps with pricing.

Discussion

A total of eight designs from five different vendors were received. Each design was reviewed for conformance with the guidelines outlined above and the top two designs are shown on Attachments A and B. These designs are conceptual in nature and will be refined in the final design process to better fit the existing space at Fischer Park and to incorporate feedback received during the PRC meeting. Staff also visited park sites in neighboring jurisdictions to view and evaluate both manufactures equipment.

The design submitted by Landscape Structures (Attachment A) appears to best meet the needs of the community and is consistent with the character of Jack Fischer Park. Staff recommends moving forward with this layout. As an alternative, the design submitted by Miracle Play Systems (Attachment B) also provides good value for the community. Staff did not rate this design as favorable due to play elements, aesthetics, and cost considerations. Staff will continue to include Miracle Play Systems as an alternative in future projects.

In addition to new play equipment, the resilient / rubber surfaces will be replaced, the sand at the swings will be replaced with either engineered wood fiber or a resilient

surface, sand in the remaining sand areas will be replaced, the fence around the tot-lot will be brought up to current safety code, and gates will be installed at the two entries to the tot-lot. The total cost for park renovations is estimated at about \$300,000, while the current CIP budget is \$100,000

Staff is asking the Parks and Recreation Commission to consider and evaluate the proposal being recommended by staff. Based on Commission input, staff is planning to move forward with a recommendation to Council to move forward with this project, subject to specific conditions.


Next Steps

Staff will prepare construction documents and finalize the cost estimate for presentation to City Council on December 6th. Feedback and guidance received at this meeting will be incorporated in the final construction documents. Should Council approve the design package, it would be advertised for bid the following week. Construction is expected to begin by early February 2017 and to be complete by the end of May 2017.

Subject: Community Center Play Area Design Project

The City's Capital Budget for FY16/17 includes funding for the design of a Children's Play Area at the Community Center. The funding for the construction phase is programmed in FY17/18. The goal of this project is to address the Community Center's need for a play area for school age children – adjacent to the sports fields.

To begin work on this project, staff is planning to seek the City Council's authorization in December to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for landscape architect services. The scope of the RFP will be focused on site investigation, such as grading and drainage issues. Staff will return to the Parks and Recreation Commission – most likely in February – to provide additional information about the project and to seek guidance from the Commission before proceeding with design work for the play area.
